Introduction

The Alliance for Health Promotion (A4HP) Internship is an opportunity for members of the International Pharmaceutical Students' Federation (IPSF) who are interested in contributing to priority actions in the workplan of the Alliance in collaboration with civil society actors for healthier populations.

About A4HP

The Alliance for Health Promotion (A4HP), was registered with the State of Geneva since 2008. It is a coalition of international Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs), academic institutions, and other Civil Society actors from different sectors. The A4HP was established in 1997 at the 4th WHO Global Conference on Health Promotion in Jakarta. NGOs from different sectors with a strong commitment to health promotion are among its founding members. Through its wide network, the Alliance reaches out to local communities, even those in remote areas.

The vision is to empower people to live healthier lives through awareness training, advocacy, networking, knowledge sharing, capacity building and partnerships. The Alliance Mission is to strengthen global efforts to improve health by bridging the gap between international declarations and local realities, catalyzing and galvanizing CSOs health promotion actions and, advocating for a holistic approach to health.

The Alliance aims to function as a bridge between grassroots and international initiatives. The Alliance is in Official Relations with the World Health Organization (WHO) and has Consultative Status with United Nations Economic and Social Council (UN ECOSOC).
